



DORAL > 7 miles from Campus

Doral is a thriving business hub, attracting multinational corporations and fueling a strong local economy. The city offers an active lifestyle with well-maintained parks, green spaces, and recreational facilities for outdoor activities and community events. Students have the opportunity to dive into the vibrant culture with year-round festivals, art exhibitions, and music performances. Explore a range of shopping and delicious dining options, including destinations like Downtown Doral and CityPlace Doral.

WYNWOOD is 15 miles from Campus

Wynwood, Miami's artistic and cultural hub, buzzes with one-ofa-kind street art, trendy boutiques, and diverse dining options, there is always something new to try! Wynwood boasts one of the county's liveliest cultural scene with art walks and epic events, including the mind-blowing iii Points festival, where music, art, and tech collide for a two-day immersive experience. Stylish establishments and eclectic nightlife set the tone as the sun sets. Wynwood is a dynamic community, continuously evolving with new businesses and cultural spaces, offering an ever-changing urban lifestyle.

COCONUT GROVE | 12 miles from Campus

The Grove has a relaxed atmosphere with stunning waterfront views, an artsy bohemian vibe, and a foodie-friendly landscape. Its historic charm, outdoor havens, and cultural events, notably the annual Coconut Grove Arts Festival, foster a strong sense of community. Explore the bay-front Barnacle State Park with its mangrove forest or the iconic Vizcaya Museum and Gardens. The neighborhood's lush parks, waterfront scenery, and proximity to dining and shopping at CocoWalk make it an ideal setting for relaxation and (long) study breaks.

BRICKELL/DOWNTOWN MIAMI > 15 miles from Campus

Living near Brickell and downtown Miami means enjoying a lively city vibe with great career opportunities, cultural richness, and scenic waterfront views. When it's time to unwind, there's no shortage of upscale shopping and fantastic dining options. Nights are just as fun with trendy places to dance, entertaining concerts, and the excitement of Miami Heat basketball games, all easily accessible thanks to a public transportation system that simplifies navigating downtown.

MIAMI BEACH > 18 miles from Campus

Seven miles of sandy beaches and an eclectic mix of iconic architecture create the backdrop for one of the world's most popular destinations. Miami Beach is the site of the South Beach Wine & Food Festival. The four-day Festival, which has contributed more than \$37 million to FIU's Chaplin School of Hospitality & Tourism Management, presents an incomparable opportunity for our students to network and gain real-world experience in hospitality management, business, communications, and more. HOUSING CHECKLIST

A student must pay their \$200 Admissions Deposit prior to applying for housing. Students will have access to submit a Housing Agreement the business day after the fee is paid.
First-year students who pay their admission deposit by April 1 and apply for housing by May 1, will receive priority consideration for housing.
Submit your housing agreement and pay the \$100 processing fee at my.fiu.edu > student tools > student housing.
Beginning in March, gain access to roommate matching to select your roommates for the Early Fall or Fall semesters.
In May, pick your room and assign yourself to it through the online self-selection process.
By June 1st, receive your assignment and roommates' contact information to prepare for your arrival!
